Reza Kahlili

Former undercover CIA operative
with the Iranian Revolutionary Guards



“Reza Kahlili” is the pseudonym of a former Iranian Revolutionary Guard member who worked undercover as a CIA agent for several years in the '80s and '90s.

Educated in Tehran and the U.S., he joined the Guard believing it would be part of a democratic Iranian future. Disillusioned by the atrocities he witnessed, he returned to America and emerged as “Wally,” a CIA spy risking daily exposure in the dangerous world of counterintelligence.

He is the author of *A Time to Betray: The Astonishing Double Life of a CIA Agent Inside the Revolutionary Guards of Iran*, a winner of The National Best Books 2010 Awards. Today a U.S. resident, he is an active voice for a free Iran.

Dr. Sharon Baradaran is President of the Y&S Nazarian Family Foundation, with a branch in Israel named Ima Foundation, created to promote and support educational causes throughout the United States and Israel. She currently teaches as an adjunct professor at the University of California Los Angeles in the Department of Political Science, and is the founder of the UCLA Israel Studies Program, housed in the university's International Institute, and is Chair of its Advisory Board.

Dr. Baradaran sits on the boards of American Friends of Hebrew University, American Society of the University of Haifa, the Iranian Jewish Women's Organization, and serves on the Executive Committee and the Education Pillar of the Jewish Federation of Los Angeles.

Prof. David Menashri is the Founding Director of the Center for Iranian Studies, Incumbent of the Parviz and Pouran Nazarian Chair for Modern Iranian Studies, Senior Research Fellow at the Moshe Dayan Center for Middle Eastern and African Studies, and Professor at the Department of Middle Eastern and African History at Tel Aviv University.

He has been a visiting Fulbright scholar at both Princeton and Cornell Universities, and a visiting scholar at the Universities of Chicago, Melbourne, Munich and Waseda (Tokyo). In the late 1970's, he spent two years conducting research and field studies in Iranian universities on the eve of the Islamic Revolution. His latest publication, with Liora Hendelman-Baavur, is *Iran: Anatomy of Revolution*.
